

# A home reflection for when you cannot attend a funeral

*During these unusual times we may find ourselves unable to attend the funeral of a friend, colleague or even a family member. This will be upsetting but on most occasions there will be a gathering to celebrate at a future date. In the meantime you might like to use the following on the day of the funeral, at the time of the funeral to help you feel at one with others who are grieving.*

**Before you find a quiet place sit you might like to gather some of the following, a photograph of the person if you have one, write down a memory, a candle to place on a table in front of you or pick a flower to place it on a table in front of you.**

**In the following where there is an N please replace with the name of the person who has died.**

In Jesus name Amen.

that you are still loving us,  
sure in every darkness  
that you are still guiding us,  
sure in death  
that you are giving us life for evermore.  
Amen.
